Description

Refuge Parenting Education Class is a 10-week course that covers a variety of topics that are relevant to parenting in today's world. The emphasis of the curriculum is on building strong parent and child relationships that are based on trust and respect.

Main Objectives

- 1. To increase the knowledge base of parents
- 2. To build parenting skills
- 3. To help parents develop and increase the ability to empathize and nurture
- 4. To provide psychoeducation on child development

Topics Covered

- 1. Principles of Nurturing: Discussion of "The Big Six," defining nurturing parenting the 7 Principles of Nurturing Parenting
- 2. Brilliant Brains: Explaining parts of the brain, deep dive into what trauma is, and an extensive look into the consequences of trauma
- 3. Toxic Stress and ACE's: Understanding what toxic stress is and its impact, Adverse Childhood Experiences, or ACEs, discussion of prevention of ACEs, Positive Childhood Experiences, or PCEs, concluding with where to begin
- 4. Ages and Stages of Development: Developmental expectations through different stages of development and the Attachment Theory
- 5. Unhealthy Relationships: Extensive dive into domestic violence
- 6. Developing Empathy: Defining empathy and why it matters, Maslow's Hierarchy of Needs, connecting meeting children's needs and empathy, and looking into how to develop empathy in ourselves and our children
- 7. Recognizing and Understanding Emotions: Understanding, identifying, managing, and expressing emotions
- 8. Self-Worth and Power Struggles: Defining personal power, power struggles and self-worth, and looking into needy versus spoiled children
- 9. Parenting Styles: Defining discipline, discussing the 4 main parenting styles, physical discipline, and concluding with positive discipline
- 10. Deeper Dive into Understanding Discipline: establishing parenting routines, tips for coparenting, establishing family rules, consequences, how to manage behaviors, and rewards and praises
